## The Romans in Britain




A variety of original and replica archaeological objects, documents and information to illustrate life in Britain at the time of the Romans.

The resource includes background information on Britain at the time of the Roman invasion, Roman glass making, villas, military organisation and Roman sites within Nottinghamshire.

Also included is a timeline, book of suggested activities and an information card for each object. These are all securely packed in conservation standard museum cases.

## The resource contains the following objects

Assorted cups, bowls and flasks, mortaria, an original handle from an amphora, samian ware and oil lamps and fragments of original samian ware pottery.





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The resource can be used to meet the requirements of the national curriculum for **history** in the following areas of **subject content**:

- KS1 Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality
- **KS2** The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain Local history study
- **KS3** An aspect or theme in British history that consolidates and extends pupils' chronological knowledge from before 1066 Local history study

The activity pack and supporting information contains activities and information that can be used to meet the requirements of the national curriculum for **English**, **art and design**, **geography** and **drama** at **KS1** to **3**.
