The Vikings and Anglo-Saxons



A variety of original and replica objects to illustrate life in Britain in the time of the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons.

The resource contains supplementary information about the period and lifestyles of the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings, including case studies of the Staffordshire Hoard, Beowulf, Nottingham in the period and other significant figures.

Also included is a timeline, book of suggested activities and an information card for each object. These are all securely packed in conservation standard museum cases.

The resource contains the following objects

A suit of chainmail, cooking pot, Viking drinking horn, original Anglo-Saxon burial urn fragments, bone dice and cup, original spearheads, coins, jewellery, a Viking shield, tafl set and a beautiful replica Anglo-Saxon helmet.



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The resource can be used to meet the requirements of the national curriculum for **history** in the following areas of **subject content**:

- **KS1** Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality
- **KS2** Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots The Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England Local history study
- **KS3** Study of an aspect or theme in British history that consolidates and extends pupils' chronological knowledge from before 1066 Local history study

The activity pack and supporting information contains activities and information that can be used to meet the requirements of the national curriculum for **English**, **art and design**, **geography** and **drama** at **KS1** to **3**.
