

The Ancient Egyptians



A variety of original and replica objects to illustrate life in Ancient Egypt. The resource contains a book of suggested activities and starting points for teachers, copied extracts from the diary of Howard Carter as he excavated the tomb of Tutankhamun and an information card for each object.

These are all securely packed in conservation standard museum cases.

The resource contains the following objects

An amulet of the God Bes, arrowhead, various storage jars and jugs, a cat goddess figure, a vase, a model boat and a pair of Shabti figures.



The resource can be used to meet the requirements of the national curriculum for **history** in the following areas of **subject content**:

KS1 Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally

KS2 The achievements of the earliest civilisations (depth study of Ancient Egypt)

KS3 Study of a significant society or issue in world history and its interconnections with other world developments.

The activity pack and supporting information contains activities and information that can be used to meet the requirements of the national curriculum for **English**, **art and design**, **geography** and **drama** at **KS1** to **3**.
